Gray wolves (*Canis lupus*) can live up to 12 years in the wild. They can be 2.5 feet high at the shoulder and weigh between 88 -105 pounds depending on their gender. Wolves have been seen along Katmai's coast hunting sea otters and harbor seals, and have even been seen fishing alongside the brown bears of the Brooks River.
