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HISTORY

On February 8, 1917, Congress authorized Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Site through Public Law 39 Stat. 901. The land transfer took place in 1926 when the U.S government secured a clear land title and in 1928 the War Department took over administration of the site. In 1933, Executive Orders 6166 and 6228 transferred the administration of the site to the National Park Service (NPS). In 1935, Congress established Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park (KEMO) under Public Law 49 Stat. 423 “to interpret for the visiting public the Civil War, 1864 Atlanta Campaign, and the Battle of Kolb Farm and Kennesaw Mountain. In addition, the park is charged with preserving the historic and cultural objects contained in it for the benefit and inspiration of people today as well as future generations.”

Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield is comprised of 2,884 acres located in Cobb County, Georgia, three miles west of Marietta and twenty-three miles northwest of Atlanta. It is irregularly shaped, measuring nearly seven miles north to south and only two miles east to west, at its widest point. The park is divided into three sections by the intersection of Dallas Highway and Burnt Hickory Road. Big and Little Kennesaw Mountains dominate the northern sections of the park with the remainder containing ridges and rolling hills characteristic of the Georgia Piedmont region.

Whites settled Cobb County, Georgia throughout the 1830s, setting up 50 to 150-acre subsistence farms. Peter Valentine Kolb constructed the Kolb house and the Kolb cemetery located at Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield in 1836 and 1839 respectively.

On May 7, 1864, the Atlanta Campaign began under the command of Union general William Tecumseh Sherman. Union forces pushed Confederate forces south from Chattanooga from May to June; at which time Confederate Lt. Col. S. W. Presstman laid down defensive lines around Kennesaw Mountain. On June 18-19, Confederate forces fell back to the defensive lines established at Kennesaw Mountain. The Battles of Kolb’s Farm and Kennesaw Mountain occurred on June 22 and 27 respectively. On July 2, Sherman and his Union forces outflanked the Confederates and they retreated towards Atlanta. After the Civil War, agricultural use of the battlefields resumed.

In 1887, veterans of the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain held the blue-grey reunion; the first commemoration held on the property that would become Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park.

Lansing J. Dawdy, a veteran of the 86th Illinois Regiment, purchased 60-acres of land including Cheatham Hill in 1899. In 1900, he conveyed the Cheatham Hill property to Martin Kingman and John McGinnis, representatives of the Kennesaw Memorial Battlefield Association. Kingman and McGinnis finally transferred the parcel to the Colonel Dan McCook Brigade Association in 1904.

The Kennesaw Mountain Battlefield Association, with the goal of erecting a monument, began a fundraising campaign. The association asked veterans from the 85th, 86th, and 125th Regiments, Illinois Volunteer Infantry, Company I, 2nd Illinois Light Artillery, the 22nd Indiana Regiment Volunteer Infantry, and the 52nd Ohio Volunteer Infantry to contribute for the monument. The association quickly realized their inability to raise the required funds and therefore requested aid from the State of Illinois.

Once the association raised the required funds, they enlisted McNeel Marble Company to erect the

monument upon the spot the Federal assault peaked. On the 50th anniversary of the battle, June 27, 1914, the association unveiled the monument. The united Daughters of the Confederacy, the Daughters of the American Revolution, and the Marietta Chamber of Commerce participated in the ceremony and the Governor of Illinois, prominent citizens, and veterans attended the ceremony.

The Kennesaw Mountain Battlefield Association, recognizing it could not restore the battlefield, offered the 60 acre tract to the US Government, but the land could not be accepted without Congressional approval. Rep. Joseph G. Cannon of Illinois introduced legislation to accept the property. Congress passed a bill authorizing the Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Site in 1917, but verification of clear title to the land delayed acceptance until 1926.

Legislation in 1926 authorized an inspection of Kennesaw Mountain to determine the appropriateness of the creation of a national memorial military park. The commission unanimously favored the designation for Kennesaw Mountain and recommended the park should be at least 1,050 acres and include Big and Little Kennesaw Mountains and the saddle in between. Multiple bills to expand the park were introduced over a nine year period following the commission's findings, but each failed to gain enough support for passage.

In 1926, the site was under the jurisdiction of the War Department and under the immediate supervision of the superintendent of the Marietta National Cemetery. After an inspection by the acting inspector general in 1931, the War Department allocated \$500 for the care of Kennesaw Mountain for fiscal year 1932 and \$500 for repairs on the Illinois Monument. A second inspection revealed a caretaker had been hired, an entrance road constructed, and most of the 60-acre parcel fenced. After his second visit, the inspector general recommended construction of a better entrance road, finishing the fencing, removal of underbrush near the monument, and partial restoration of the trench system, but the site was transferred to the Department of the Interior, in 1933, before the War Department could complete any further work. Chickamauga-Chattanooga National Military Park Superintendent Richard B. Randolph administered the site. On June 26, 1935, Congress approved the creation of Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park including Big and Little Kennesaw Mountains and other significant portions of battlefields.

The National Park Service completed two inspections of the property in 1934. The first inspection suggested forest cleanup, grubbing out the broom sedge, disposal of the rocky litter, and erosion control and the second recommended regrading the stream slope and the use of riprap for to control erosion and re-establishment of 40 acres of terraced hillsides and lowlands as meadows. Work began in April 1934 with the use of both skilled and unskilled laborers. The Civil Works Administration (CWA) and the Public Works Administration (PWA) funded and completed most of the work.

The Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) completed all park development work between 1938 and 1942. The CCC established CCC Camp NM-3, also known as "Camp T.M. Brumby," at Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park in 1938 and a rock quarry in 1939. During the period of CCC work at Kennesaw Mountain, CCC workers contributed 1283 mandays on road construction, 215 mandays on building the repair shop, 225 mandays on construction of toilets, 70 mandays on erection of signs, and 79 mandays on building renovations. The CCC's most critical work at Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park was the construction of roads. They began the operation of a quarry in 1939 to facilitate the work. They completed a road from Dallas Road to Cheatham Hill, slope work on Highway 41, and began work on the road up the mountain, which proposed to upgrade a road constructed by the Kennesaw Mountain Battlefield Association in the 1920s. Work on the mountain road was not completed during the CCC

period due to the beginning of World War II. The park completed the mountain road in 1950.

As with many units within the National Park Service, the Mission 66 program, which began in 1956 to prepare for the centennial of the National Park Service, facilitated most of the development work at the park. During the Mission 66 period, the park restored the Kolb house, dedicated the Georgia Monument at the foot of Big Kennesaw in 1963, demolished the original visitor center (the Hyde House), completed a new visitor center, constructed two employee residences and an oil house (completed in 1965 and 1966 respectively), and completed landscaping around the visitor center in 1966. The Mission 66 program also allowed for road improvement and additional trail construction and improvements. Due to the need for trail maintenance, the utilization of Youth Conservation Corps (YCC) labor began in 1975.

In 1964, the Georgia Hall of Fame Committee constructed the granite Georgia Overlook on Big Kennesaw and dedicated it to the memory of the 14 Confederate generals from Georgia that fought at the Battle of Kennesaw. Unfortunately, poor construction due to pressure to stay on schedule resulted in 40% of the memorial being closed by June 1966 for safety concerns.

Through the 1970s and 1980s the park marked the park's boundaries, erected rail fencing around open fields, cleared selected vistas, cleaned the Illinois and other monuments, removed the picnic tables and toilets from Cheatham Hill, installed interpretive exhibits and signs at select locations in the park, created/paved parking areas, and restored the Georgia Overlook.

In 1991, the park replaced the eagle atop the Illinois Monument, which lightning damaged in 1984. In 1997, the park began a renovation and expansion of the Visitor Center; it opened in 1999 during the 135th anniversary of the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain. The park commemorated the 150th anniversary of the battles of Kennesaw Mountain and Kolb Farm in June of 2014, which was a part of a larger year-long sesquicentennial commemoration held at Civil War sites throughout the National Park Service.

DESCRIPTION Records document the functions and activities of Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park. The records document the preservation, interpretation, maintenance, and administration related to Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park and related historic structures. The records also document exhibits created by the park through project and research files.

This collection contains central files, correspondence, reports, project files, historical research, program records, articles, maps, drawings, photos, oral histories, videos, scrapbooks, and newspapers relating to KEMO. The strengths of the collection encompass the Civilian Conservation Corps (CCC) activities on site, oral histories from park staff as well as CCC workers, historical research, and an extensive photograph series that document park events and landscapes.

ORGANIZATION The collection is organized into twelve series: Series I, General Administration Records; Series II, Cultural Resource Records; Series III, Interpretation Records; Series IV, Natural Resources Records; Series V, Facilities Management Records; Series VI, Records of the Supervisory Ranger's Office; Series VII, Civilian Conservation Corps Records; Series VIII, Visual Materials; Series IX, Audiovisual Materials; Series X, Maps and Plans; Series XI, Scrapbooks and Ephemera; and Series XII, Press Releases and Newspaper Clippings.

PROVENANCE Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park created and collected the materials in this collection in connection with official park activities.

SERIES DESCRIPTIONS

SERIES I: GENERAL ADMINISTRATION RECORDS, 1927-2013

Organized into four subseries: Subseries A, Central Files; Subseries B, Superintendent's Records; Subseries C, Lands Records; and Subseries D, Related Admin. Records.

Series documents the administrative function, activities, and evolution of Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park.

SUBSERIES A: CENTRAL FILES, 1927-2013

Organized into one sub-subseries: Sub-subseries 1: Central Files to 2013. Though there is only one sub-subseries, it was included to leave room for future accretions.

Correspondence, project files, statements of management, acquisition and loan files, public relations slides, and various reports and plans.

SUB-SUBSERIES 1: CENTRAL FILES, 1927-2013

Arranged alphanumerically, thereunder alphabetically by folder title, thereunder chronologically.

Correspondence, project files, statements of management, acquisition and loan files, public relations files, law enforcement records and incident reports, interpretation records, land records: deeds, maps, and drawings; news clippings, newsletters, periodicals, visual records: film, photographs, slides; and various reports and plans related to trail use, event anniversaries, property acquisition—both land and objects, land use, cooperative agreements, among others. This sub-subseries contains records created from nearly every position at Kennesaw Mountain National Battl

SUBSERIES B: SUPERINTENDENT'S RECORDS, 1939-2013

Arranged alphabetically by folder title.

Correspondence, event records, PMIS reports, and other reports created by multiple Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park superintendents and other individuals presenting these records to the superintendents related to the separation of Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park from its former friends association, event planning, and creation of PMIS reports to improve the park.

SUBSERIES C: LAND RECORDS, 1928-2001

Arranged alphabetically by folder title.

Lands records not included in Subseries A: Central Files including deeds, maps, surveys, and correspondence related to ownership records and land acquisition for various pieces of land in the

parks.

SUBSERIES D: RELATED ADMINISTRATION RECORDS, 1935-2013

Arranged alphabetically by folder title.

Correspondence, project files, statements of management, acquisition and loan files, public relations files, law enforcement records and incident reports, interpretation records, land records: deeds, maps, and drawings; news clippings, newsletters, periodicals, visual records: film, photographs, slides; and various reports and plans. While similar in appearance to Subseries A: Central Files, this subseries contains records documenting administrative functions at the park which were not originally integrated into the central files related to interpretive planning for new programming, re-doing the exhibits in the visitor center, 1996 Olympics planning, Kolb Farm, Youth Conservation Corps (YCC), special use permits, cooperative agreements, and property acquisition: facility, land, and objects; and research materials among other records.

SUBSERIES E: KENNESAW MOUNTAIN HISTORICAL ASSOCIATION RECORDS, 1967-1989

Arranged alphabetically by folder title.

Fiscal records, financial audits, correspondence, slides, handbook, membership records, merchandise records from the Kennesaw Mountain Historical Association a former cooperating association of Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park.

SUBSERIES F: CIVIL WAR SESQUICENTENNIAL RECORDS, 2013-2014

Retains original order. Arranged by function.

Documents planning and logistics for Civil War Sesquicentennial activities at Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park by a taskforce out of Great Smoky Mountains National Park.

SERIES II: CULTURAL RESOURCES RECORDS, 1940-2012

Organized into six subseries: Subseries A, General Subject Files; Subseries B, Plans and Reports; Subseries C, Records of the Historian's Office; Subseries D, Section 106 Compliance Records; Subseries E, Museum Records; and Subseries F, Volunteers in Parks.

Research, plans, reports, correspondence, project files, section 106 files, interpretation, oral histories, copies of articles, and copies of primary sources related to natural resources, museum administration, historic weapons, and compliance with federal regulations concerning historic sites and structures.

SUBSERIES A: GENERAL SUBJECT FILES, 1940-2012

Arranged alphabetically by folder title.

Historical research, notes, slides, programs, archaeology, and manuals related to interpretation, the

CCC at KEMO, battlefields, and historic structures related to Mike Bearrow's oral history project, Kolb's Farm, exhibits, and cultural landscapes.

SUBSERIES B: PLANS AND REPORTS, 1977-2011

Arranged alphabetically by folder title.

Correspondence, project files, archaeological surveys, and meeting notes related to earthworks, historic preservation, trails, and resource management related to black history focus group, Cobb County Historic Preservation Commission, and script for Dennis Kelly's book.

SUBSERIES C: RECORDS OF THE HISTORIAN'S OFFICE, 1940-2012

Organized into five sub-subseries: Sub-subseries 1, Correspondence; Sub-subseries 2, Black Powder and Historic Weapons Records; Sub-subseries 3, Project Files; Sub-subseries 4, Subject Files; Sub-subseries 5, Scouting Project Records; and Sub-subseries 6, Desk Files.

Correspondence, historical research, reports, project files, maps, publications, and copies of primary sources related to the Civil War, the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain, park projects, interpretation, and historic weapons. The historian from 1999-2014, Willie Johnson, managed the Section 106 compliance as a collateral duties at KEMO; therefore, some Section 106 compliance records may be filed in the Project Files or Subject Files.

SUB-SUBSERIES 1: CORRESPONDENCE, 1993-2008

Arranged alphabetically by folder title.

Correspondence related to park administration, historical research, a land purchase, artillery, maps, and edits for publications related to a travel brochure, 11th Iowa, and 4th Ohio LT Artillery. Correspondents of note are Nancy Milton for park administration and Dr. Keith Bohannon for historical research.

SUB-SUBSERIES 2: BLACK POWDER AND HISTORIC WEAPONS RECORDS, 2000-2008

Arranged alphabetically by folder title.

Inventories, orders, purchases, reports, plans, inspection, procedures, and catalogues related to living history weapons demonstrations, gun cleaning, misfire procedures, inspections, and artillery care related to cannons, muskets, and living history.

SUB-SUBSERIES 3: PROJECT FILES, 1992-2012

Arranged alphabetically by folder title.

Reports, scripts, proposals, PMIS, research and assessments related to cultural landscapes, historic structures, events, and anniversary celebrations related to the Wallis House, National Trail Day, tree removal, exhibit film, and 144th anniversary.

SUB-SUBSERIES 4: SUBJECT FILES, 1941-2008

Arranged alphabetically by folder title.

Correspondence, publications, maps, drafts of articles, speeches, newspaper articles, reports, notes, brochures, permits, patterns, pictures, as well as copies of letters, journals, and diaries relating to historic research, weaponry, battle lines and formations, natural resources, and park policies related to the Battle of Kennesaw Mountain, the Atlanta Campaign, the Civil War, Gilgal Church, Civil War era medicine, the Ohio Soldier, Reid Ross research, hospitals, and education.

SUB-SUBSERIES 5: SCOUTING PROJECT RECORDS, 1987-2014

Arranged alphabetically by folder title.

Correspondence, reports, research, proposals, and applications relating to scout projects completed on park property related to trail maintenance projects completed by scouts.

SUB-SUBSERIES 6: DESK FILES, 1982-2014

Arranged alphabetically by folder title.

Correspondence, research, publications, maps, speeches, articles, notes, permits, and photos relating to historic research, weaponry, park policies, and natural resources related to archaeology, American Battlefield Protection, Civil War 150, new park film, the Gilpen collection, the Kennesaw Mountain Historical Association (KMHA), earthwork preservation, brochures, and staff rides.

SUBSERUES D: SECTION 106 COMPLIANCE, 1975-2008

Arranged alphabetically by folder title.

Reports, proposals, correspondence, research, and notices relating to archaeology, trail construction, road construction, and facilities such as the Noonday Creek Trail, VC air conditioning replacement, earthworks, a bridge replacement, and a cell tower. Some Section 106 compliance records may be located in the Records of the Historian's Office since the historian Willie Johnson also oversaw Section 106 compliance at the park.

SUBSERIES E: MUSEUM RECORDS, 1989-2012

Arranged alphabetically by folder title.

Reports, interviews, surveys, foreign language translations, and scripts relating to interpretation, exhibits, conservation of museum objects, environmental management, and collections. This subseries also contain interpretation materials since all park rangers work with interpretation.

SERIES III: INTERPRETATION RECORDS, 1975-2015

Organized into two subseries: Subseries A, Exhibits Records; Subseries B, Program Records; and Subseries C, Visitor Services.

Reports, research, meeting notes, purchase records, exhibit text, purchase records, and correspondence relating to exhibits, educational programs, and waysides. Subjects include exhibit construction and planning, interpretation plans, and lesson plans. This series also includes some museum records as interpretation also takes place in the form of museum exhibits.

SUBSERIES A: EXHIBIT RECORDS, 1991-2003

Arranged alphabetically by folder title.

Bills, research, correspondence, meeting notes, lists of graphics, brochures, drafts of exhibit text, and requisitions regarding exhibit construction and planning, lighting, images needed for exhibit panels, and permissions from other institutions for use of images. The exhibit planning notebooks are arranged in chronological order.

SUBSERIES B: PROGRAM RECORDS, 1975-2011

Arranged alphabetically by folder title.

Reports, evaluations, notes, proposal, and pamphlets relating to educational programs, lesson plans for park staff and teachers, long range interpretation, and funding. Topics include African American history, the Junior Ranger program, the Monday Night Program, and sesquicentennial information.

SUBSERIES C: VISITOR SERVICES, 1989-2015

Arranged alphabetically by folder title.

Reports, logs, and surveys including visitation numbers related to visitation and visitor understanding of interpretation offered at the park.

SERIES IV: NATURAL RESOURCE RECORDS, 1954-2009

Arranged alphabetically by folder title.

Reports, inventories, correspondence, notes, procedures, and reports and surveys regarding inventory and monitoring, herpetology, wildlife, and water at KEMO.

Topics include flies in the mountains, endangered species, threatened species, birds, plant species, and water quality.

SERIES V: FACILITIES MANAGEMENT RECORDS, 1941-2013

Organized into two subseries: Subseries A, Park Project Files and Subseries B, SERO Project Files.

Reports, photos, correspondence, and project files regarding KEMO structures, roads, and trails.

SUBSERIES A: PROJECT FILES, 1990-2013

Arranged alphabetically by folder title.

Reports, photos, correspondence, and project records relating to trail construction, visitor center maintenance, construction, and preservation including visitor center photovoltaics project, onsite parking, the Wallis house, and construction of curatorial storage.

SUBSERIES B: SERO PROJECT RECORDS, 1941-2005

Arranged alphabetically by folder title.

Reports, specifications, notes, correspondence, requisitions, plans, compliance, memoranda, submittal data, permits, proposals, construction drawings, estimates, manuals, general information, data sheets, architectural drawings, contact information, articles, pamphlets, maps, contract documents, survey documents, trip reports, job descriptions, samples, and submittals from the records of the Southeast Regional Office related to park projects including archeology, fire suppression system, beacon tower, park boundaries, sewers, residences, utilities, signs, exhibits, Gilbert Road, headquarters area, HVAC, maintenance building, Illinois monument, Kolb Farm, monuments repointing, trails, roads, oil house, parking areas, Powder Springs Road, painting, T. J. Gilbert House, visitor center.

SERIES VI: RECORDS OF THE SUPERVISORY RANGER'S OFFICE, 1986-2011

Organized into three subseries: Subseries A, Desk Files; Subseries B, Case Incident Reports; and Subseries C, Permits.

Project files, reports, notes, and permits referring to park events, employee records, projects, and park policies. Records in this series document the duties and activities of the supervisory park ranger at KEMO.

Arranged alphabetically by folder title.
