



**Steep Cliffs**  
The cliffs of Tomales Point are likely to crumble and slide. Climbing on them or walking near the edge invites catastrophe. Because of falling rocks, walking below cliffs is dangerous. Keep away!

**High Tide**  
Check tide tables before walking on beaches. Rising water can trap you against a cliff with no possibility of escape.

**Heavy Surf**  
The pounding surf, rip currents, and severe undertow are treacherous, especially at McClures Beach, Kehoe Beach, and Point Reyes Beaches North and South. Stay away from the water.

**Temporary Seasonal Closures**  
The section of Point Reyes Beach between the North Beach and South Beach parking lots may be temporarily closed to pets in the summer due to nesting western snowy plovers.

**Pets**  
All pets must be restrained at all times while in the Seashore on a leash no longer than six feet. Pets may not be tied to an object and left unattended, or be allowed to make unreasonable noise.
