

William Busbey Official Discharge - June 18, 1864

Discharge Certificate

To all whom it may Concern:

Know ye, That William H. Busbey a Sergeant of Captain Ralph Hunt[cut off] Company, (C,) 1st Regiment of Kentucky Infantry VOLUNTEERS who was enrolled on the thirtieth day of April one thousand eight hundred and Sixty-one to serve Three years or during the war, is hereby Discharged from the service of the United States, this Eighteenth day of June, 1864, at Covington K [crossed out] Kentucky by reason of Expiration of term of Service.

(No objection to his being re-enlisted is known to exist.) [see footnote below]

Said William H. Busbey was born in Clarke County in the State of Ohio, is Twenty two years of age, 5 feet 8/9 inches high, Medium complexion, Hazel eyes, Dark hair, and by occupation, when enrolled, a School Teacher.

Given at Covington, Ky this Eighteenth day of June 1864.
