It is hereby certified That in conformity with the laws of the United States Mary Early Widow of William G Early who was a Private Co C [sic] 25 Regiment Ill "Vol." Infantry is entitled to a pension at the rate of Twelve dollars per month, to commence on the Twentieth day of June 1888 and to continue during her widowhood, unless she shall forfeit her right thereto. And she is also entitled to two dollars per month additional for each of the following named children while living and under the age of sixteen years. to wit:

That section forty seven hundred and forty-five, title fifty-seven of the Revised Statutes of the United States is hereby amended to read as follows,

Sec. 4745.-Any pledge, mortgage, sale, assignment, or transfer of any right, claim, or interest in any pension which has been, or may hereafter be, granted shall be void and of no effect, and any persons who shall pledge or receive as a pledge, mortgage, sale, assignment or transfer of any right, claim or interest in any pension or pension certificate which has been, or may hereafter be granted or issued, or who shall hold the same as collateral security, for any debt or promise or upon any pretext of such security or promise shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars and the costs of the prosecution, and any person who shall retain the certificate of a pensioner and refuse to surrender the same upon the demand of the Commissioner of Pensions or the pensioner, to receive the same shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in a sum not exceeding one hundred dollars and the cost of the prosecution.
