Civil War Record of John Huffman (son of Jacob Huffman and brother to Howard Huffman) Union Army

Enlisted: August 4, 1862 at Noblesville, Indiana for 3 years in Company A, 90th, 5th Cavalry Regiment of Indiana Volunteers

Rank: Private

Engagements participated in:

1. April 18, 19, 1863 Skirmish on Cumberland River, Tennessee – drove the rebels off and burned town of Celina, Tennessee
2. July 19, 1863 attacked and drove off rebels at Buffington Island on Ohio River near Portsmouth, Ohio
3. Sept 1863 Picket firing and skirmish near Greenville, Tenn.
4. Sept 22, 1863 Battle at Blountsville, Tennessee
5. Oct 11-14, 1863 Battle near Henderson's Mill, Rheatown and Blountsville, Tennessee
6. Nov 29 – Dec 2, 1863 Skirmish at Maynardsville, Tennessee
7. Dec 14-15, 1863 Battle at Bean's Station, Tennessee
8. Jan 17, 1864 Battle of Dandridge Tennessee
9. May 13 – July 4, 1864 Campaign against Atlanta, Georgia (John Huffman was wounded on July 4, 1864)

All the battles in Tennessee were in the eastern part of the state

Occurrences [sic] during period of service:

Wounded in action in Georgia on July 4, 1864 during the campaign for Atlanta, Georgia. Sent to the field hospital and returned to duty on November 1, 1864

Discharged: At Pulaski, Tennessee on June 25, 1865

Period of Service: August 4, 1862 to June 15, 1865 (2 years 10 months and 12 days)
