- Gopher snakes look similar to rattlesnakes, but they are not poisonous.
- Gray hawks perch high in trees.
- Pipevine swallowtails love to sip nectar from tubular flowers.
- Sonoran toads' skin is poisonous to dogs.
- Gila topminnow is an endangered fish species.
- People have lived by the river for years.
