HISTORY

Charles D. Herbert was a concession employee, working as a bus driver for the Yellowstone Park Transportation Company, later the Yellowstone Park Company, in the 1930s.

DESCRIPTION

The collection consists of films and a few photographs of Charles D. Herbert's time as a bus driver for the Yellowstone Park Transportation Company in Yellowstone National Park. The films appear to document typical tourist travel around the Grand Loop Road of Yellowstone and include images of wildlife such as bears, thermal features, and developed areas such as Mammoth, Canyon, and Old Faithful. The photographic prints show the park's iconic White Co. buses—one a convertible—with tourists and a bus driver, probably Charles D. Herbert.
