HISTORY

This collection was created by the Yellowstone National Park Archives to house individual oral history collections not collected as part of a thematic or other special documentation project. In many cases, the interviewee is retiring or leaving, and the focus is on documenting the span of their careers.

DESCRIPTION

This is an artificial collection containing individual oral history interviews with Yellowstone National Park employees. It is used when the oral history was not conducted as part of another, usually thematic, documentation process. In many cases, the interview is conducted just prior to or after retirement from the National Park Service and the employee reflects upon their careers, perhaps with a focus on their time in Yellowstone. While many of the narrators were superintendents, deputy superintendents, or division chiefs, the focus of these interviews includes any employee who has served Yellowstone for an extended period or who took on a precedent setting or barrier breaking role.

PROVENANCE

Artificial collection created by the Archives to house otherwise individual employee oral histories.
